Kenmore State High School Music Extension Program (MEX)



What is the Music Extension Program (MEX)?

Music Extension (MEX) is specifically designed to extend students who have already developed sound music reading and performing skills throughout the primary years of education. This exciting program allows students to develop advanced musicianship skills in a challenging atmosphere, with other likeminded musicians. Students enrol for a full 2.5 year course and are required to participate in at least one school extra-curricular music ensemble (including the Year 7 choir, Vox Nova).

Music Extension involves creative performance opportunities such as full class performances, small group and solo performances. Students develop skills in a variety of instruments (including guitar and keyboard), as well as voice. Students participate in a singing-based aural program (Kodaly) to develop advanced musicianship skills. Students visually and aurally analyse music by deconstructing musical elements, and making connections with style, context and genre.









Music Extension Program – FAQ

Q: The MEX application asks for documentary evidence of my child's musical education. What is this?

A: AMEB Certificates – (the highest certificate only), Trinity College certificates, references from private teachers (you do not need a reference from school instrumental teachers as these are included in your child's report card), Eisteddfod certificates, etc.

Q: My child learns an instrument at Primary School. Is he/she able to enrol in MEX?

A: Yes. The program is designed specifically for these students. They may be required to audition to see that they have achieved a satisfactory standard.

Q: My child has not completed any AMEB exams. Can he/she still apply to be in MEX?

A: Yes. Your child should obtain a reference from their private teacher outlining the standard of their playing and the duration of their learning. This should be attached to their application as part of any supporting documentation.

Q: My child sings/plays guitar/plays the drums. Can they still apply to be in MEX?

A: Yes. For guitarist - as long as your child can read music notation (not just TAB) they can apply to be in the program. If your child is auditioning on drum kit, they must also provide a video audition playing a pitched percussion instrument (e.g. xylophone or glockenspiel). *Refer to MEX Audition Requirements documentation for further information.*

Q: Will my child be required to participate in an ensemble?

A: Yes. All MEX students are required to be in at least <u>one</u> ensemble **and** the Year 7 Choir (*Vox Nova*). Rehearsals take place before school.

Q: Are there costs associated with the program?

A: There are costs associated with the Instrumental & Vocal Music Program and your child will be required to be part of this program if they are in MEX. On application for a place in a Program of Excellence, a \$200 administration fee is also required. Costs are outlined on the KSHS website.

Q: How do I submit an audition. What is involved in this process?

Music Extension auditions will be held on **Saturday 4th November 2023.** Students will be required to present their live audition in front of a panel. Please see <u>MEX Audition Requirements</u> documentation for specific details. In addition to this live audition, students are also required to sit a written music theory test.
