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Kenmore State High School Music Extension Program (MEX)



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OVERVIEW

Music Extension (MEX) is an academic classroom subject specifically designed for students who have already developed sound music reading and performance skills during their primary years of education. This exciting program provides a unique opportunity for students to refine their musicianship skills in a supportive and challenging environment alongside peers who share their passion for music.

Music Extension is a 2.5 year program. Successful applicants are expected to remain in the Program of Excellence for the entirety of the course until the end of Year 9. Students who wish to continue can then choose to reselect Music Extension as part of their Year 10 subject selection.

Students are also required to participate in at least one of our school's extra-curricular music ensembles enhancing their experience through diverse musical collaborations. Involvement in the Junior Choir, *Vox Nova* is strongly encouraged as it strengthens aural and musicianship skills essential to the MEX classroom curriculum.

The MEX program involves a range of creative performance opportunities such as full-class, small group, and solo performances where students gain confidence and proficiency in multiple instruments, including guitar and keyboard, as well as developing their aural skills.

A strong emphasis is placed on aural-vocal development, ensuring students refine their listening skills and musical expression as they progress through the program.

Students will gain a greater understanding of music by exploring musical elements and their relationships to style, context, and genre, both visually and aurally. This approach to music education ensures that MEX students are well-equipped with the skills and knowledge needed to excel in all aspects of life.









UNIQUE EXPERIENCES AVAILABLE THROUGH MEX

Music Extension offers students the opportunity to elevate their musical abilities well beyond the traditional classroom setting through a range of engaging and enriching experiences. MEX students have access to a range of exceptional opportunities, such as:

- Interactive Workshops: Participate in hands-on sessions such as African drumming and Kaboom Percussion, exploring diverse musical styles.
- Working with Universities on Composition Projects: Work alongside tertiary composition students from the University of Queensland and Griffith Conservatorium of Music to develop advanced composition techniques.
- **Live Performance Experiences**: Attend professional musical theatre productions to gain insight into the art of live performance.
- **Specialist Jazz Workshops:** Learn from industry professionals through in-class sessions with the Jazz Music Institute (JMI).
- Recording and Producing Original Music: Record and produce original songs in state-of-the-art
 facilities at the Queensland University of Technology (QUT) while collaborating with tertiary
 music students.
- **Diverse Performance Opportunities**: Showcase talents in unique settings, such as busking at Open Day, performing at art showcase evenings, and entertaining at parent breakfasts.
- Queensland Symphony Orchestra (QSO) Compose Project: Collaborate with QSO mentors to create an original orchestral work, culminating in a live performance by the QSO at their Southbank studio.

These experiences are designed to inspire creativity, enhance technical skills, and provide students exposure to the professional music world.









COMINATION OF MEX AND GERMAN IMMERSION OR KENX

Students have the unique opportunity at Kenmore SHS to combine MEX with another Program of Excellence:

- Music Extension + German Immersion (GIEP)
- Music Extension + KENX

Alternatively, students may choose to apply for Music Extension as a standalone program.

Advantages of combining MEX with GIEP or KENX:

Broader Skill Development: Combining these programs equips students with diverse competencies, from creative problem-solving to advanced academic reasoning.

Enhanced Cognitive Abilities: Research shows that music education strengthens areas of the brain associated with memory, focus, and multitasking. Learning a language or engaging in critical thinking (KENX) can boost problem-solving abilities, which are also critical in musical composition and analysis.

Cultural and Global Awareness: Language introduces students to another culture, enhancing their understanding of global perspectives. Paired with studying world music or culturally rich compositions in Music Extension, students gain a well-rounded appreciation for diversity.

Time Management and Resilience: Balancing two Programs of Excellence helps students master time management and build resilience. These skills are invaluable for future studies and careers.

Creative and Analytical Balance: Music Extension offers an outlet for creativity and emotional expression, balancing the structured and logical focus of other subject areas.

Teamwork and Individual Growth: Programs like Music Extension involve collaboration (e.g., ensemble performances), while academic programs often emphasise individual achievements. This balance fosters both teamwork and personal accountability.

Future-Ready Skills: Proficiency in a second language, advanced academics, and musical talent are sought-after skills in the modern job market. These programs prepare students for diverse fields, from STEM and humanities to the arts and beyond.

These Programs of Excellence support the development of the six 21st Century learning competencies – critical thinking, creativity, communication collaboration, character and citizenship. By pursuing more than one Program of Excellence, students build a rich foundation of skills and experiences, setting themselves up for academic, professional, and personal success.



TIMETABLE

Music Extension is a classroom subject integrated into the regular school timetable alongside other core subjects such as Mathematics, English, and Science. Students receive three 70-minute lessons per week with their classroom music teacher.

In Year 7, students participate in Music Extension for one semester, allowing them to explore an alternative elective in the other semester.

- MEX only students Semester 1
- German Immersion (GIEP) or KENX students + MEX Semester 2

Once in years 8 & 9, all students will participate in MEX for **both** semester 1 & 2.

INSTRUMENTAL & VOCAL MUSIC PROGRAM

Students in MEX are also required to participate in our comprehensive and highly regarded Instrumental Music and Vocal Music Program. Students will be assigned an initial ensemble based on their MEX audition, with all students also strongly encouraged to participate in the Junior Choir (Vox Nova)* as this helps strengthen and build musicianship skills used in the MEX classroom. Students can participate in multiple ensembles.

COMMITMENT

Students who accept an offer to join the Music Extension (MEX) Program of Excellence are committing to the following:

- Completion of the 2.5 year program: Students are expected to remain in the program for the entirety of the course until the end of Year 9. Students who wish to continue can then choose to reselect Music Extension as part of their Year 10 subject selection.
- Active participation in the Instrumental and Vocal Music Program: Students must be enrolled in at least one ensemble. Involvement in the Junior Choir, Vox Nova is strongly encouraged as it strengthens aural and musicianship skills essential to the MEX classroom curriculum.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: The MEX application asks for documentary evidence (if applicable) of my child's musical education. What is this?

A: AMEB Certificates – (the highest certificate only), Trinity College certificates, references from private teachers (you do not need a reference from school instrumental teachers as these are included in your child's report card), Eisteddfod certificates, etc.

Q: My child learns an instrument at Primary School. Is he/she able to enrol in MEX?

A: Yes. The program is designed specifically for these students. All applicants will audition for the MEX program.

Q: My child has not completed any AMEB exams. Can he/she still apply to be in MEX?

A: Yes. Your child will have the opportunity to showcase their musical ability during the live audition.

Q: My child sings/plays guitar/plays the drums. Can they still apply to be in MEX?

A: Yes. For guitarist - as long as your child can read music notation (not just TAB) they can apply to be in the program. If your child is auditioning on drum kit, they must also audition on a tuned percussion instrument (e.g., xylophone or glockenspiel).

Q: Will my child be required to participate in an ensemble?

A: Yes. Students must be enrolled in at least one ensemble. All Year 7 MEX students are also required to participate in the Vox Nova choir. Rehearsals take place before school at 7:30am.

Q: Are there costs associated with the program?

A: Yes. **MEX:** a \$200 administration fee is required when applying for a place in a Program of Excellence. Full details of the costs can be found on the KSHS website.

Q: How do I apply? What is involved in this process?

Round 1 offers for Year 7 students commencing in 2026 have been finalised. However, an additional opportunity to secure limited remaining places in this program will take place on Enrolment Day (June 14th). All 2026 students are encouraged to attend our Open Day on May 24th.

Students auditioning will be required to present their live audition in front of a panel. Please see MEX <u>Audition Requirements</u> documentation for specific details. In addition to this live audition, students are also required to perform a short sight-reading exercise on their auditioning instrument as well as sit a short written music theory test aimed at an AMEB preliminary level (note identification, rhythmic values, musical signs and definitions).
